Did you know that the United States not only houses the largest library in the world -- the Library of Congress, with over 175 million items -- but there are more libraries in our country than Starbucks or McDonalds! And while most of us can probably come up with a few facts about baseball (every MLB ball has 108 stitches) and our flag (there are six American flags on the moon), here are some facts you may not have known about one of our most American institutions:

- The New York Public Library's most borrowed book for 2023 was *Lessons in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmus.
- The New Berlin Public Library's most circulated book in 2023 was *The Four Winds* by Kristin Hannah. The most circulated nonfiction book at the NBPL was *I'm Glad My Mom Died* by Jennette McCurdy.
- There are over 123,000 libraries in the U.S. today
- One of our country's oldest libraries was founded in Massachusetts in 1790 and began with donations from Founding Father Benjamin Franklin
- As of 2023, there were nearly 117,000 public and academic libraries in the U.S

Libraries are arguably the very brick and mortar symbol of our First Amendment: Freedom of Speech. During July, this most patriotic of months, it's nice to appreciate all the things we love about America, including our libraries. As Albert Einstein once said, "The only thing that you absolutely have to know is the location of the library."
